One named Peter,

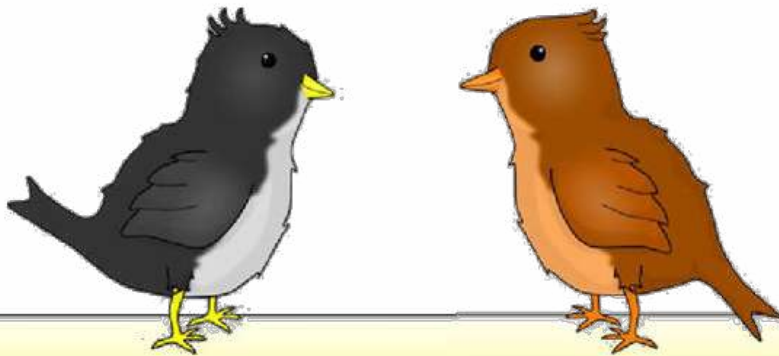
One named Paul.

Climbed up the spout again.



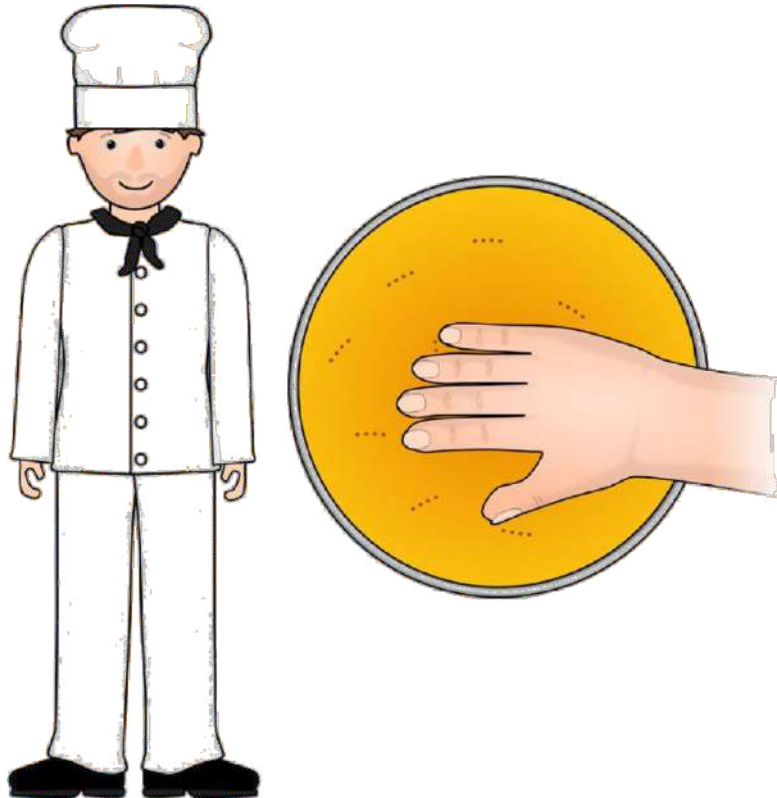
# Pat-A-Cake

Pour me out!



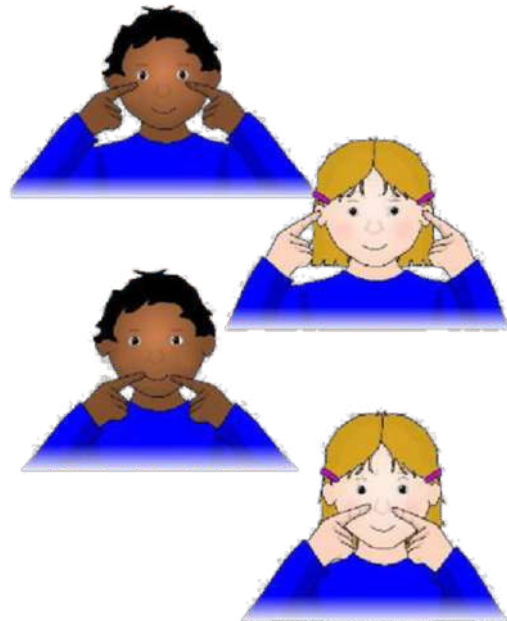
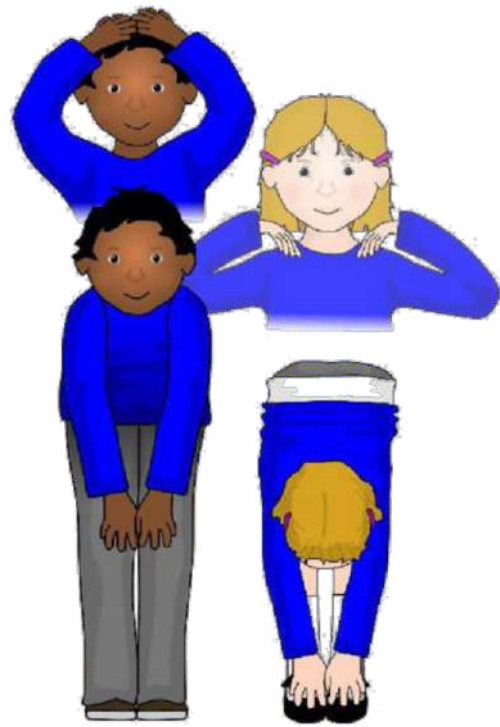

As the stones went down the pot, the water level started to rise. Now the crow was able to drink water. He drank the water happily and flew back to his tree.

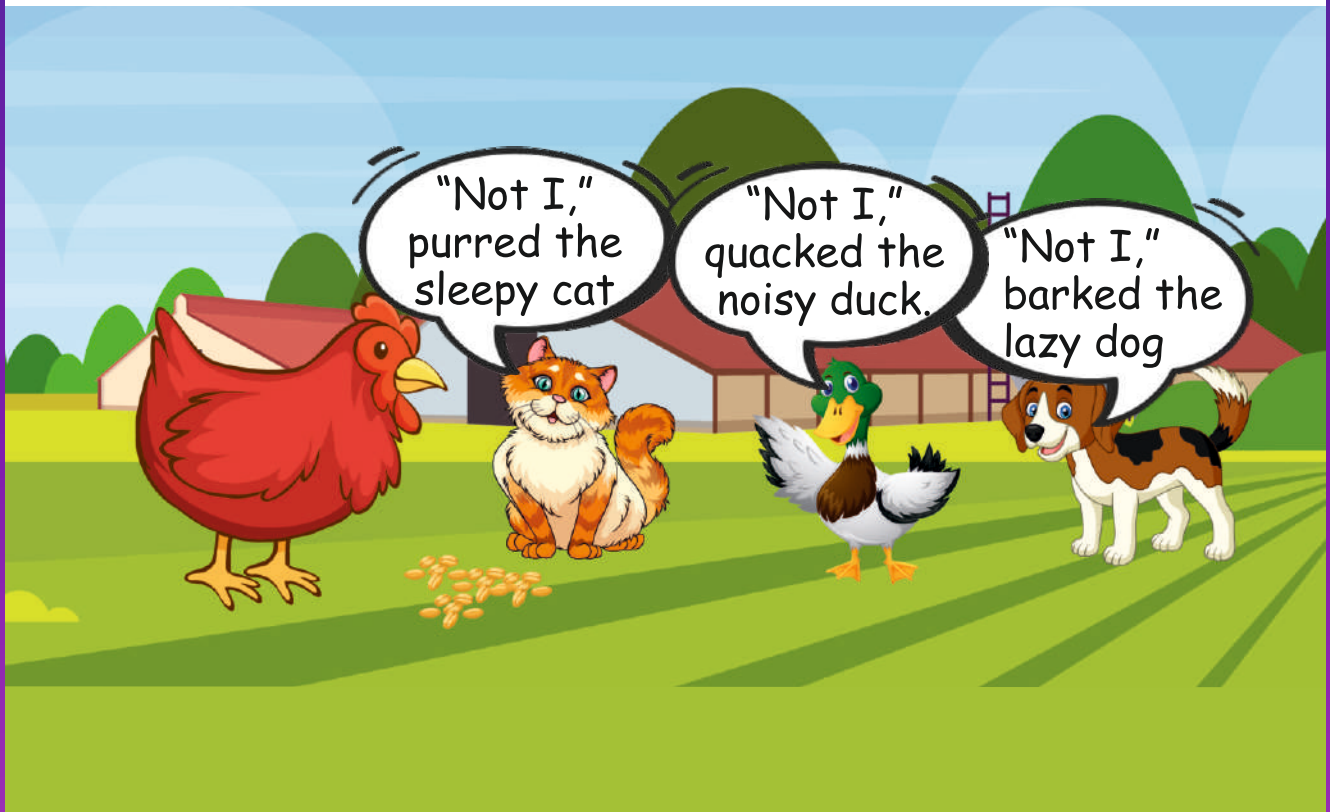
# The Little Red Hen



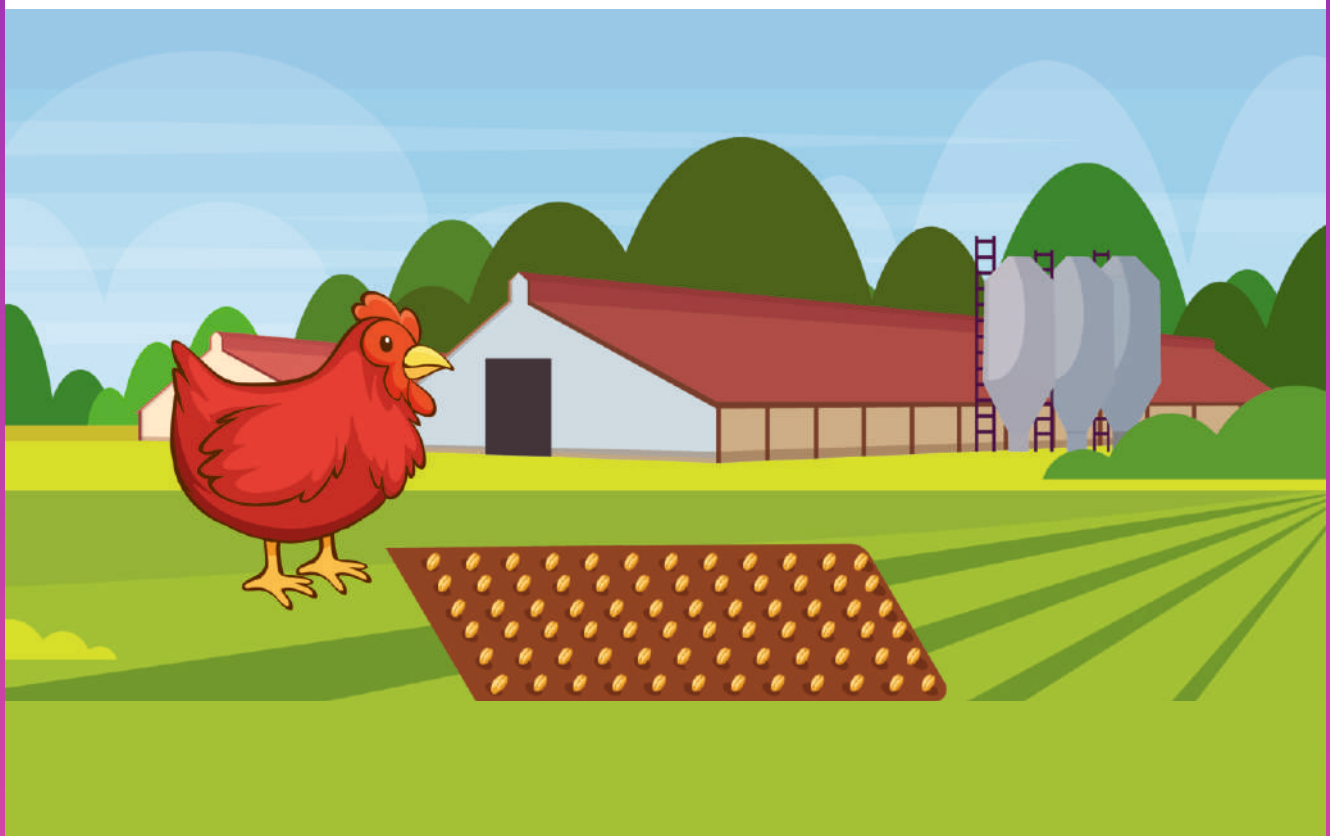
Once upon a time, there was a Little Red Hen. The Little Red Hen lived on a farm with her three friends.



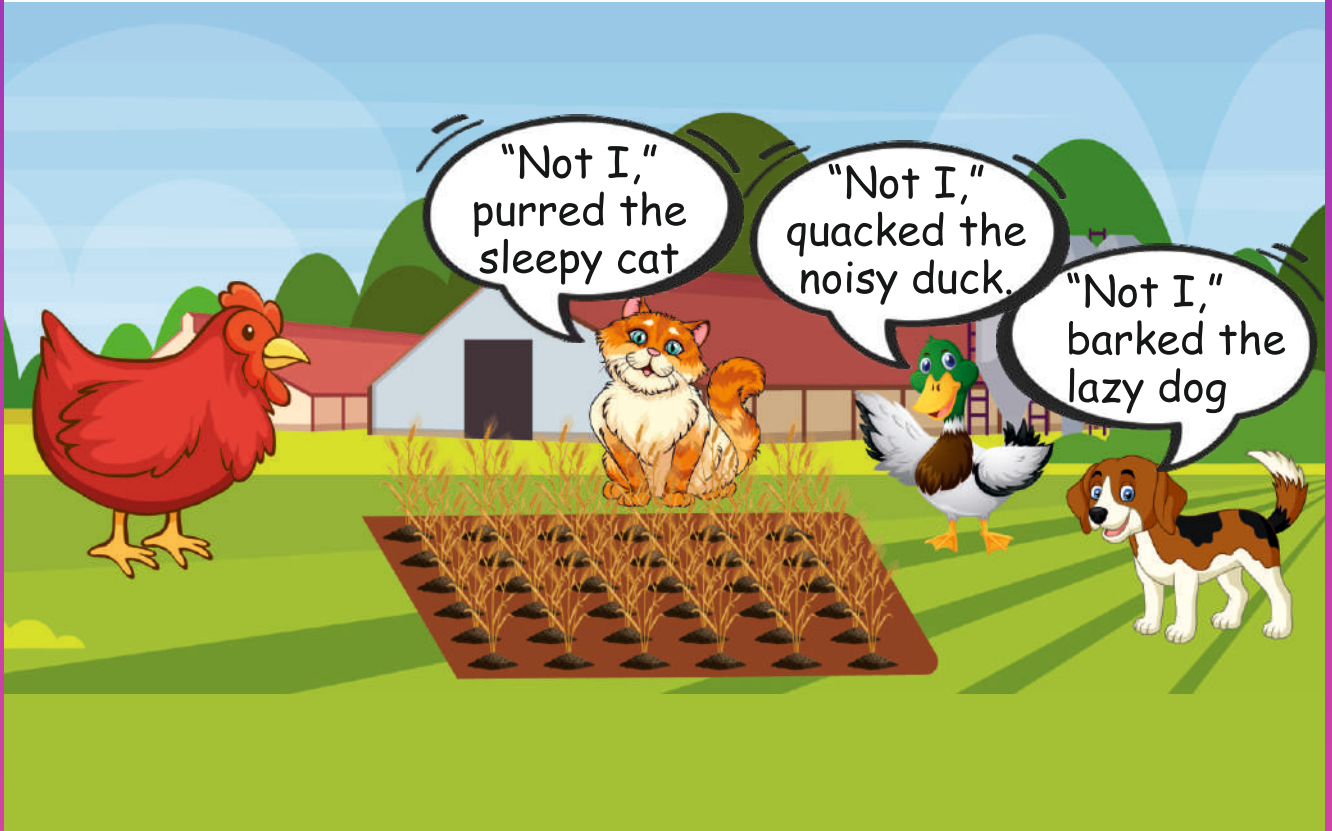
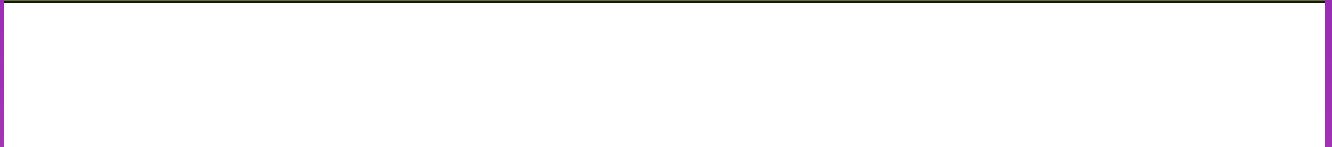
One day, the Little Red Hen found some grains of wheat on the ground. "Who will help me sow these grains of wheat?" the Little Red Hen asked.

"Then I will," said the Little Red Hen. So the Little Red Hen took the wheat to the mill, ground the wheat into flour and carried it back to the farm all by herself.



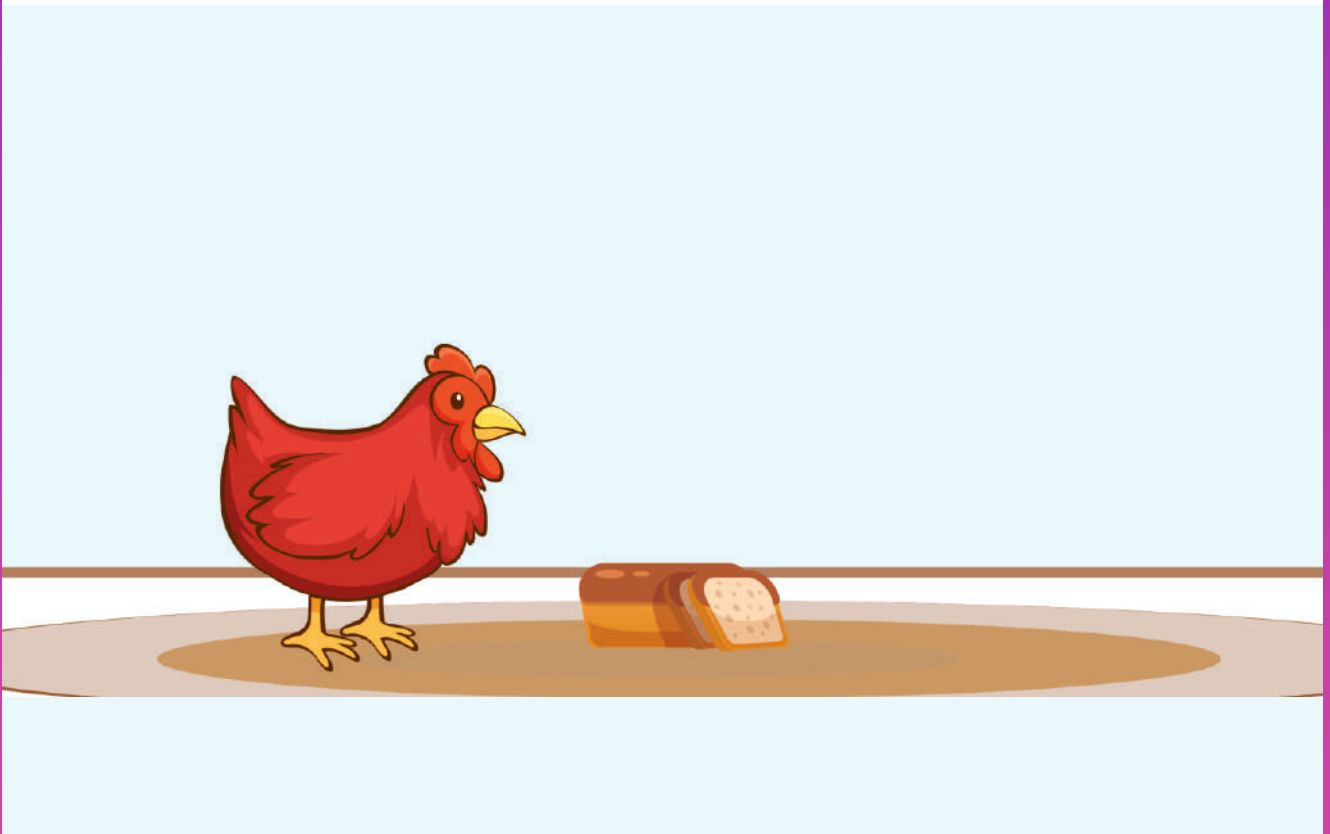
By now the Little Red Hen was tired. "Who will help me bake the bread?" asked Little Red Hen.

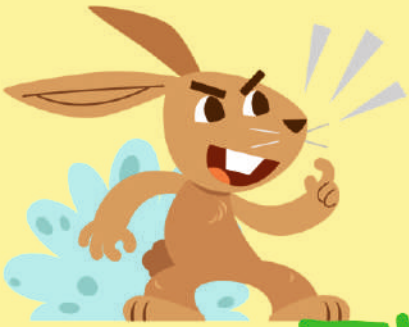

"How do you expect to win this race when you are walking along at your slow, slow pace?" he cried out to the tortoise.



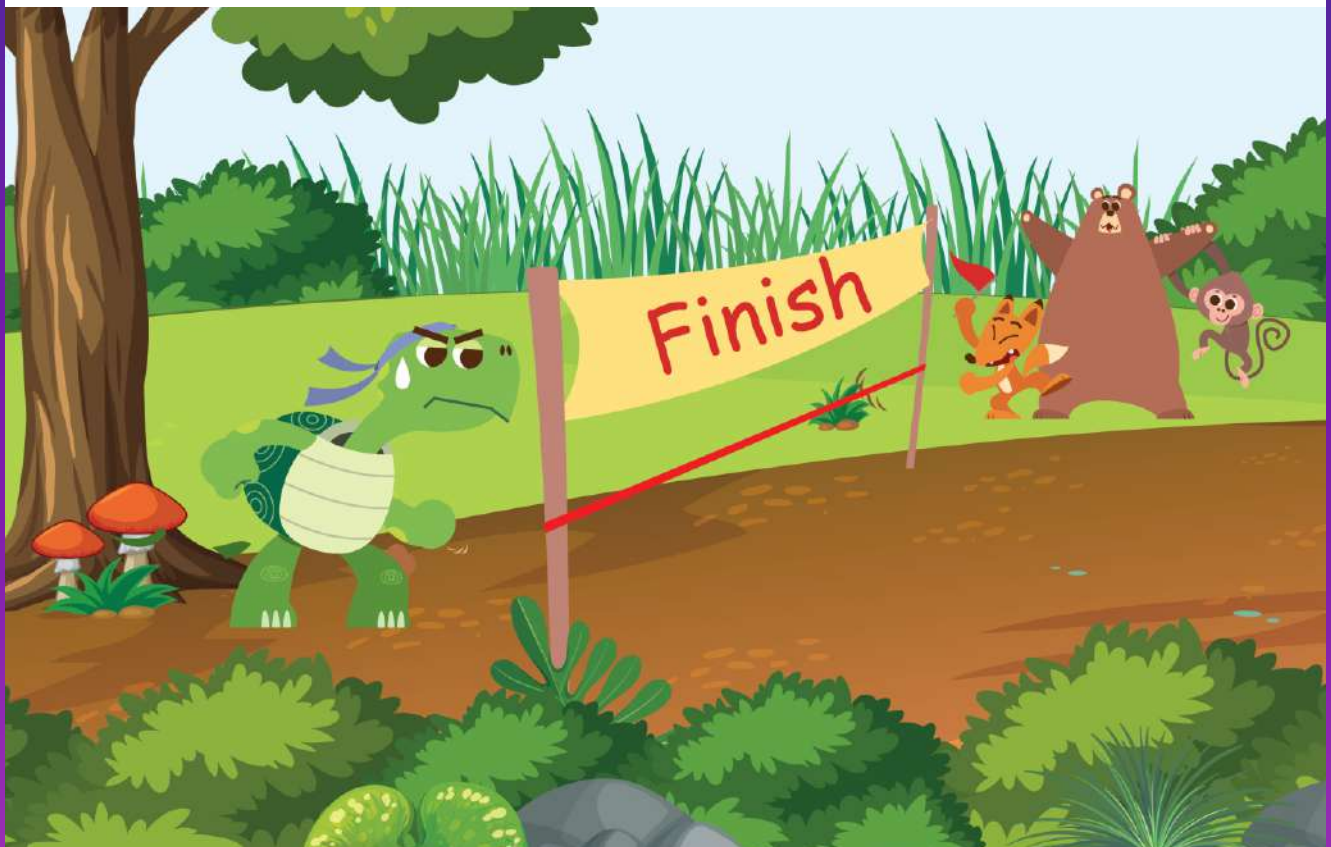
The hare stretched himself out next to a tree and fell asleep thinking, "There is plenty of time to relax".



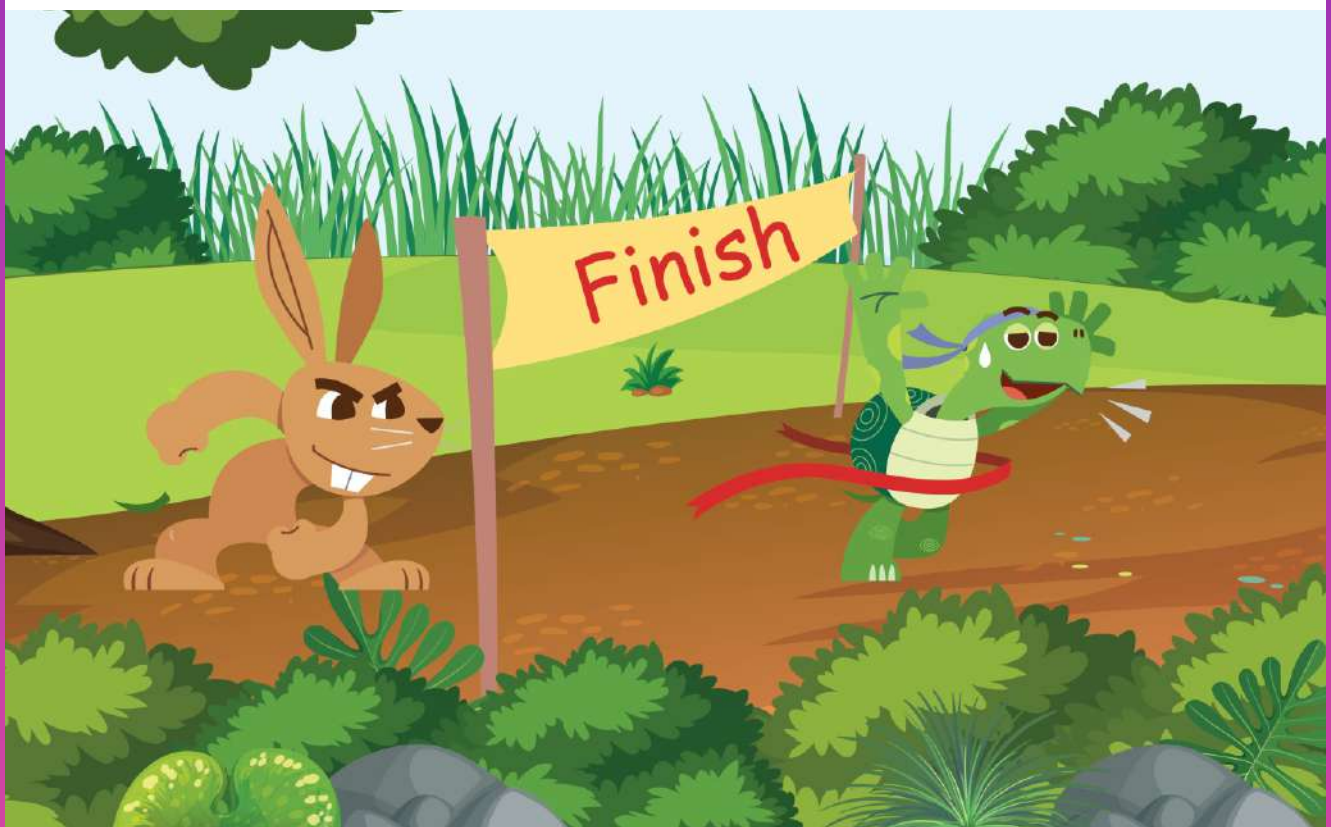
The tortoise walked and walked. He didn't stop until he got to the finish line.
